5 PRINICIPLES OF FRUITFUL LEADERSHIP

Hold Fast to Your New Identity: A New Creation

You are a new creation. Receive and embrace your new identity. More than a label, your new identity defines who you really are (2 Cor 5:17).

Activate Growth: Growing in Christ

You are a branch on the vine that is Christ, partaking of the spiritual life and vitality that is in Him (Jn 15:4-8). Drawing from His resources and His character, you are to make every effort to grow in the grace and knowledge of God (2 Peter 3:18).

Living With-God

You are with Him, learning to be like Him. Without lagging behind or getting ahead of Him, the fruitful Christian leader **follows** Christ and seeks His direction *before* moving forward (Lk 9:23, Joshua 1:8).

Valuing People

God speaks with your life, not simply your words. Fruitful Leaders invest in others, modeling what they want them to be. (Col 1:28-29, Lk 6:40)

Commissioned Worker

You are commissioned for Eternal Kind of Work: Your life work is discipleship; integrating others into a team with a vision of multiplying disciples, offering encouragement and support (Mt 28:18-20).

Key Elements of a Healthy Financial Plan

Vision

Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keeps the law, happy is he (Prov 29:18).

Having a clear vision for your financial plan is crucial to gaining control over your money and achieving long term financial **peace.** It empowers you to make intentional choices, prioritize your goals, and live freely with significance.

Time

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil (Eph 5:15-16).

The time value of money is essential in financial planning as it helps individuals account for the opportunity cost, inflation, investment growth, risk, and uncertainty associated with future cash flows. By considering these factors, financial planning enables individuals to make better-informed decisions and optimize the financial resources for both short-term and long-term goals.

Counsel

Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers they succeed. Whoever trusts in his own mind is a fool, but he who walks in wisdom will be delivered (Prov 15: 22; 28:26).

Accountability

He who listens to a life-giving rebuke will be at home among the wise. He who ignores discipline despises himself, but whoever heeds correction gains understanding. (Prov 15:14; 31-32)

Perseverance

Steady plodding brings prosperity. Hasty speculation brings poverty (Prov 21:5).

Steady plodding is a better strategy than hasty speculation because it promotes disciplined and consistent progress over time, reducing the risk of impulsive and potentially costly decisions. By taking a measured and patient approach, individuals make more informed choices, minimize losses, and increase the likelihood of achieving sustainable long-term success.

God Owns Everything

Everything in the heavens and earth **is yours**, O Lord, and this is your kingdom. We adore you as being **in control** of everything. Riches and honor come from you alone, and you are the Ruler of all mankind; your hand controls power and might and it is at your discretion that men are made great and given strength (2 Chron 29:11). Purposeful Debt Free Living

Being out of debt provides individuals with freedom and peace of mind, as they no longer have to allocate a significant portion of their income towards debt payments, and they can instead use that money for savings, investments, or other financial goals leading to increased generosity/giving.

Abundant living means having the capacity in your life to **invest in eternal things.** The essential skill of a fruitful leader is reserving time for optimizing physical, spiritual, and emotional vigor while preserving and protecting close relationships.
